This activity not only allowed students to practice critical forensics techniques but also encouraged teamwork and attention to detail as they mimicked real-life crime scene procedures.

#### **STEAM Camp**






The Liberty Partnerships Program took a group of OIMS students to participate in a STEAM day camp organized by SUNY Fredonia.

## Stellar Squad



## **Behavioral Expectations at East View**




It should come as no surprise that a significant part of our students' academic success correlates directly to the exemplary behavior that they exhibit. To ensure a safe and orderly educational environment conducive to student learning, East View staff, along with staff across the district, have been working collaboratively in the best interest of children by recognizing and identifying appropriate behavior, proactively building healthy relationships and a sense of community with and among our students, as well as working with individuals who may have committed harm to take full responsibility for their behavior.

To strengthen our environment, we are pleased to share that we have integrated Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) into our Leader in Me programming which has been a main stay within Olean City School District for the past several years. Research-based, PBIS is designed to compliment the 7 Habits by pro-actively teaching respect, responsibility and safety at school all the while building a stronger foundation and culture of caring. Through direct modeling and positive reinforcement

of expected behaviors, East View students continue to excel in a stimulating environment where everyone is safe, respectful, responsible, and kind. Further, they are also members of learning communities that are less reactive, aversive, and exclusionary, and more engaging, responsive and productive.

During the summer months, EV and district-wide staff members identified and highlighted behavioral expectations from the classrooms and hallways to the bathrooms and play areas. These items were documented via our Behavior Expectations "Matrix," which has been posted throughout the building for quick reference when promoting positive behaviors or when reteaching may be needed. Vibrant and captivating posters were also developed to help draw attention to what we expect throughout the school day. Our main goal of this body of work is for all students to know how a "Husky Nation" student shows prideful leadership.

We are excited to be proactively nurturing student leadership, responsibility, as well as a positive school environment at East View, laying a strong foundation for our students' future academic and personal success.







## **Bus Safety**





We are excited to share that our students have also been learning all about bus safety! Ensuring that everyone know how to stay safe while riding a school bus is a priority. Did you know that bus safety is not only important, but also required within New York State? Each year, schools must conduct three "bus drills" to help students understand the proper procedures for staying safe while riding and what to do should an emergency occur. This year, Dave Young, our Transportation Supervisor, worked with our students and lead their safety discussions and demonstrations—including safely exiting via the rear door.

Road Map to Foster Parent Certification What steps do I need to take to become a certified foster parent?

- 1. Call the Foster Care Home Finder, Amanda (716) 338-3016
- Attend an Informational Meeting to learn more about the certification process
- Begin MAPP/GPS training process (we meet once a week for 10 weeks)
- Start the home study process. Two home consults will need to be completed.
- Complete background checks on all adult members 18 and older in the household. This includes fingerprinting, SCR (child abuse) clearance and justice center clearance.
- 6. Provide at least 3 references and employment verification
- Home Finding team meets to review the home study and make approval decisions
- Complete MAPP/GPS.
- 9. Certification Process is complete!
