Public Comments:

Pam Neary - 527 Second Avenue - urged the Board of Education to support and allocate money for a full-day PreK program by noting the social, economic and educational benefits to young children. Pam noted that children that participate in the PreK program are 50% less likely to end up in a Special Education program, less likely to end up in jail, drop out of school or go on welfare. Mrs. Neary asked the BOE to find the necessary money to fund a full day program and questioned whether or not money from the sale of buildings could be used. A recommendation for savings to fund a full day program would be to revisit the recommendations from the Feasibility Study as there were additional recommendations other than closing schools.

Emily Chamberlain – 112 S. 25th Street – noted that she is a parent of a child that has benefited from the PreK program. Emily noted that 50% of the families in the district fall within the poverty level. She is concerned about children that fall in the poverty range getting solid educational and social experiences. Mrs. Chamberlain further stated that the foundation of education is similar to the foundation of a house - it needs to be strong so that it doesn't crumble. Due to the academic demands in grades K-12, students need this strong foundation at an early age. She asked the Board of Education to look at funding a full day PreK program.

Kim Ackerman – 112 E. Ohio Street – noted that she when PreK went from half day to full day a few years ago, she was against it, however, seeing the benefits and the positive effects, she is now in favor of keeping a full day program. Kim noted that a lot of PreK students don't get good meals at home and get healthy meals at school. A full day program helps students at risk. President Obama has stated that there would be more funding for pre-school programs. Reducing the program would be a step backwards.

Cindy Johnson - 515 York Street - noted that three years ago she was assigned to the PreK program. For three years she has attending workshops and staff developments geared toward PreK. Learning isn't what it used to be - there are more demands on learners. Students in PreK are learning their numbers, letters, motor skills, and blending letters for works. As a PreK teacher, she does not see how you could fit full day PreK instruction into a half day program. Mrs. Johnson asked the Board of Education to think twice about reducing the program and distributed an invitation to attend her classroom at WW on Tuesday. March 26th during the PreK center time (10:20 am to 11:20 am).

Board member Eric Garvin asked the public speakers if they could provide data that shows the trends/benefits of the PreK program. Three to four years ago the District received the Early Reading First grant which allowed the District to go from a half day program to a full day program – what is the data that shows where students that attended ½ day PreK are compared to students that have attended full day PreK.

Laurie Branch noted that the arguments are very persuasive and noted in order to reinstate the PreK program to full time, it would cost \$232,000.

Paul Knieser noted that the NYS Governor and the President state they want PreK programs. however, they continue to take money away from education - where would the money come from to fund full day PreK - where else would we have to cut?

Mike Martello noted that funding one program would require the district to cut another program he compared this practice to shifting chairs on the deck of the Titanic. A 1% tax levy increase is equivalent to \$132,000.

Public Comments

Kim Ackerman noted that teachers are the ones in the trenches and they would be willing to provide input on where cuts could/should be made.

Colleen noted that the District formed a Budget Advisory committee and invited community members, teachers, parents, and business leaders to join the committee and that would have been a great opportunity for teachers to provide input.
