

Andrew Jackson: Tyrant?

The students in Mr. Perry's JCC College Connections history classes took part in a mock trial in which Andrew Jackson was accused of several accounts of Constitutional misconduct: the most severe charge being abuse of power. During his presidency, Jackson was called King Andrew I by his critics, due to his expansion of presidential powers. The students representing the

prosecution called witnesses to show how Jackson's actions were unconstitutional, while the defense brought forth witnesses to show Jackson's innocence. Witnesses were then cross-examined by the opposition and their responses needed to be consistent with the historical witness they portrayed. All participants also had to dress for their respective roles and could earn extra

credit by dressing in period attire. Even though it was a mock trial, the case had tense moments as the lawyers grilled the witnesses to sway the court's opinion toward their side. In addition to learning the course material, students also learned that it is up to the citizens of a nation to hold our elected official accountable to upholding the Constitution.





DECA Regional Competition at Alfred State College

On December 18, 2024, Olean High School's DECA chapter participated at Alfred State College for a Regional DECA competition. This competition consisted of students not only from Olean but from Hornell, Salamanca, and Whitesville. This special event had several business leaders that served as judges, faculty members, DECA Advisors, student volunteers, and several business education students.

Olean had the most members attend this event with 21 outstanding business students. Each student took a 100-question marketing exam and then performed a business role play showcasing their business knowledge. Eight students advanced onto the next level competing at the DECA's State Competition which is held in Rochester, NY on March 5th, 6th, and 7th.




classroom, created their own replicas of French cartes d'identités (ID cards), and, of course, sampled French foods!!




















Students in Mrs. Coulter's 7th Grade Social Studies have been busy studying colonial life and the causes of the Revolutionary War. Students were able to explore and try on various colonial outfits worn during the 1700s. They were also able to read about several colonial games, recipes, and other activities in colonial life with books on this topic. This was part of the Revolutionary Traveling Trunk series from the American Battlefield Trust. Later, after learning about the causes and effects of the Tea Act on the thirteen colonies, students made their own tea crates and tossed them into the "classroom" harbor. Lots of hands-on learning helped bring these historical artifacts to life for students.




