Broadbent, Mulryan Lead Class of 2015

Geoffrey Broadbent has been named the Valedictorian of the Class of 2015, ranking 1st out of 151 students. He is the son of George and Suzy Broadbent. He was a student in the New Visions Medical Program senior year. Geoffrey will graduate with an Advanced Regents Diploma with Honors and Mastery in Math and Science.

Geoffrey has participated in three varsity sports: soccer, swimming, and tennis. In soccer, he was named a CCAA All Star Honorable Mention his junior year. His senior year, he was named a CCAA All Star 1st



Team member, Big 30 All Star, and WNY Best Teammate Award all while being a captain of the team. In tennis, he has been a member of four CCAA championship teams and has qualified for the county tournament three times and moved on to the sectional tournament twice, and finished sectional runner up in doubles to qualify for the NYSPHSAA Tennis Tournament. Swimming, however, has been the main focus for Geoffrey. A member of the varsity team since 7th grade, he has represented Olean all six years at the sectional meet. He captained the team in his junior and senior campaigns and was the team's Most Valuable Swimmer three times. Senior year, he won Section VI Class B titles in four events and was selected Outstanding Performer of the Meet, moving on to the NYSPHSAA swim meet. He is an Olean High School record holder in five events.



We sent formal invitations home to invite parents to attend, and students read their essays aloud at the podium at the 2015 Essay Conference. Four essays were chosen to be submitted to an essay contest. Two essays will be published in the Olean Times Herald.


Success a Collaborative Effort with Community Partners




