Aila has made high honor roll for sixteen consecutive quarters from while taking advanced and college credit courses.

Aila has been involved in school activities throughout her time at OHS. She has played volleyball since her sophomore year at the junior varsity, varsity, and club levels, and participated in indoor track and golf. University's Honors Program majoring in economics with a minor in politics, philosophy, economics, and law. He hopes to become a corporate attorney.

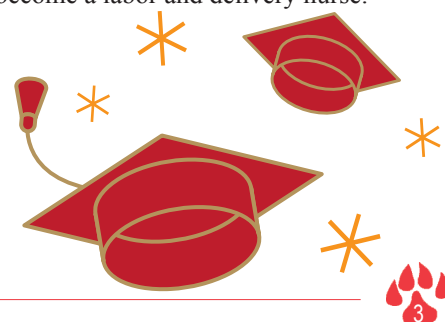

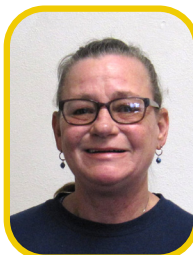

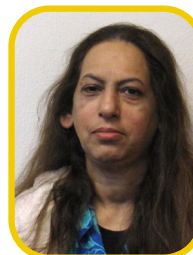
