



Summer Trips

Olean students had an opportunity to find their sense of adventure this summer as they embarked on science based field trips hosted by Mr. Freeman and Mr. Woleben. There were a total of six trips which provided a variety of options to choose from. Students worked hands on, digging up ancient trilobite and crinoid fossils at Penn Dixie in Buffalo and then traveled to the Buffalo Museum of Science where they were amazed by the new dinosaur exhibits and got the opportunity to immerse themselves in the engineering side of science within the museum.

Students also got to do some site seeing and hiking at Watkins Glen State Park where they hiked the gorge and viewed the spectacular waterfalls that flow through the area. Letchworth and Stoney Brook State Park were another locality where students were able to view the geological significance of the rock and formations all within 60 miles of the City of Olean

As we all know it is never too early to start looking at colleges and information about the work force. Students had the opportunity to view Buffalo State College and Planetarium during a tour of the campus this summer which gave an insight to what types of majors and minors are available for students post-graduation from Olean.

Traveling south now to Penn's Cave and Woodward Cave where students explored the caverns left behind from thousands of years of natural weathering and erosion. While at Penn's Cave, students took a wildlife adventure tour which showed off some of the local wildlife and educated them on how certain animal's life and strive in the environment in which they call their home.

To wrap up the summer fun, students were able to take a once in a lifetime opportunity to go white water rafting at White Water Adventures in Central PA. White Water Adventures is located just southeast of Pittsburg on the Youghiogheny River. Students were able to raft class 3 white water rapids and experience what it was like to jump off a rock into a water hole within the river itself.

Fun was had by all students and staff that were able to attend these summer trips. Mr. Freeman and Mr. Woleben would also like to thank Mrs. Gayton and Mr. Kruse for chaperoning the trips this summer. "I'm very happy with how all the trips turned out and can't wait for what the future holds," Freeman remarked. Woleben goes on to state "I hope that we have the opportunity to do this again in the near future and see what other type of trips we can plan so that students get the chance to have fun during the summer months here at Olean."

She spent much of her life living near the Genesee River. In 1824, the biography of her life was published in the form of captivity narrative. The field trip included a tour of the William Pryor Letchworth Museum and viewing Mary Jemison's statue and cabins. The students also hiked the Mary Jemison trail and continued to the Upper and Middle Falls on a beautiful fall day.
