

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
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Goreword


DEMOCRACY emphasizes the rights, the freedom and the importance of the common man in organized society. It

THE class of 1940 has the honor of being graduated on the 500th anniversary of the invention of the movable type printing press by Johannes Gutenberg. Replicas of this press and those of Bishop Zumarraga and Stephen Daye, the first presses in America and Massachusetts respectively, were displayed in March at the Friedsam Library of St. Bonaventure College, which owns them, and loaned in April to the Olean Public Library.

In our library this anniversary has been marked by the unusual number of gift books and periodicals.

First Mr. F. H. Tapp donated a 12 volume set of World Epochs, published by the American Flag Association. Then our Drama Department, under Miss Elizabeth Herzog, transferred nine plays to the library. Faculty members contributed as follows: Miss Elizabeth Baldwin thirty-three volumes, Miss Katherine Karl two, Miss Lotta Hobart three, Miss Helena Schleich six and Miss Abigail York two.

"She Stoops To Conquer" by Goldsmith, and 29 plays of Shakespeare in the Temple edition, presented last year by Mrs. L. H. Ballard, were recased by the librarian and put into circulation this year.

The above gifts totaled 97 volumes.

The Misses Hobart, Schleich, Janet Sibley, Wombough and York donated back numbers of the Atlantic, Fortune, Harper's, Reader's Digest and Theatre Arts Magazines.

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





What is every person expected to know about?


The answer is: Their city, of course!


That was really a simple question, but now can you answer this one? Do you know all there is to know about your city?



THE FIRST AID CLUB, under the auspices of the American Red Cross, was reorganized at the beginning of this school term.





CORNING FREE ACADEMY

THE christening of the 1939 football season for Olean High came on a sunny afternoon in mid-October. The place—Bradner Stadium, the opponent—Corning Free Academy. Corning drew first blood, putting over a counter in the second period after battering Olean's defense into submission. Corning came back to score a gain in the third. After desperate attempts, the Crimson finally connected a pass to Kane for their only score. Fumbles played a big role in Olean's downfall.

SALAMANCA

THE INDIANS came to town none too highly rated but they did have a big line. Olean had the ball three-fourths of the time and drive after drive fizzled out until two end-arounds, used extensively, clicked for scores. As in the previous game, Olean fumbled! and fumbled!

ITHACA

THE first out-of-town trip for the Crimson was a failure, though it gave evidence of the prowess of the Olean line. A great Ithaca team, sparked by their brilliant negro halfback, Washington, hung a 12 to 7 defeat on the Crimson. Bob Whipple was the whole show for Olean as he scored both touchdown and extra point. Olean's line bested the Ithacans after the first half and stopped the charging backs.

DUNKIRK

WITH Bobby Whipple again shining, the Crimson finally rung up victory number two. "Whip" scored Olean's first touchdown after a 40-yard sprint on a puntreturn. Not a single Dunkirk hand was placed upon him. Dunkirk tied the score in the second period, but within a space of two minutes, Olean had two more scores and Dunkirk was beaten.

JAMESTOWN

J AMESTOWN, an old rival, fell victim to Olean's now fast-moving offensive, but only by a last minute break. The teams battled each other to a standstill at 6-6, but Jack Kane, Crimson end, intercepted a desperate Jamestown pass and Olean tacked up their third victory in five starts. Little did anyone suspect that this would be the last Olean victory.

HORNELL

W HAT should have been a comparatively easy victory was turned into dour defeat for Olean, as the Red Raiders of Hornell scored a 7-6 upset on a bitterly cold night at the Maple City. Gino Giallanzo scored Hornell's touchdown and all-important extra point. Olean seemed to lack that needed scoring-punch and consequently lost.

BRADFORD

A S always, our final game of the season was with our traditional rival from across the state line, Bradford. The Owls had piled up a remarkable record of 28 straight victories without a defeat and contemplated keeping their slate clean. This they did with gusto as they proceeded to rend the Olean team to bits with charges and passes. The Crimson had only one chance to score and that faded after four tries from the two-yard line failed. Absent from the game was Olean's powerhouse center, Johnny Adams. Perhaps he would have been of help to the Crimson but ineligibility rules kept him from playing. Thus, after four quarters of merciless hammering, Bradford took full measure of Olean and plastered a humiliating 39-0 defeat on the Crimson. This game ended our football season of 1939.

INTRAMURAL SPORTS

A FTER being housed in the new school building, the athletic directors of the school, with some inspiration from the State Department of Education, decided to reestablish an intramural sports program. The winters of 1938-1939 and 1939-1940 were devoted to basketball and volleyball, while the summers were open for baseball. This form of athletics is becoming more popular each year with state educational heads and eventually may replace varsity athletics.

As soon as varsity basketball practice is well under way, the athletic directors proceed to organize basketball leagues within the school. After several weeks of play, playoffs are held to determine the winner. In volleyball, leagues are formed primarily for the purpose of instruction for the later varsity team. Assistant Coach Donald Wittenberg has charge of the volleyball teams.


VOLLEYBALL, BASEBALL AND INTRAMURAL


