The following pages show how the Olean High School in class, room, in shop and in its various extra curricular activities is working to prove itself worthy of the present generation.





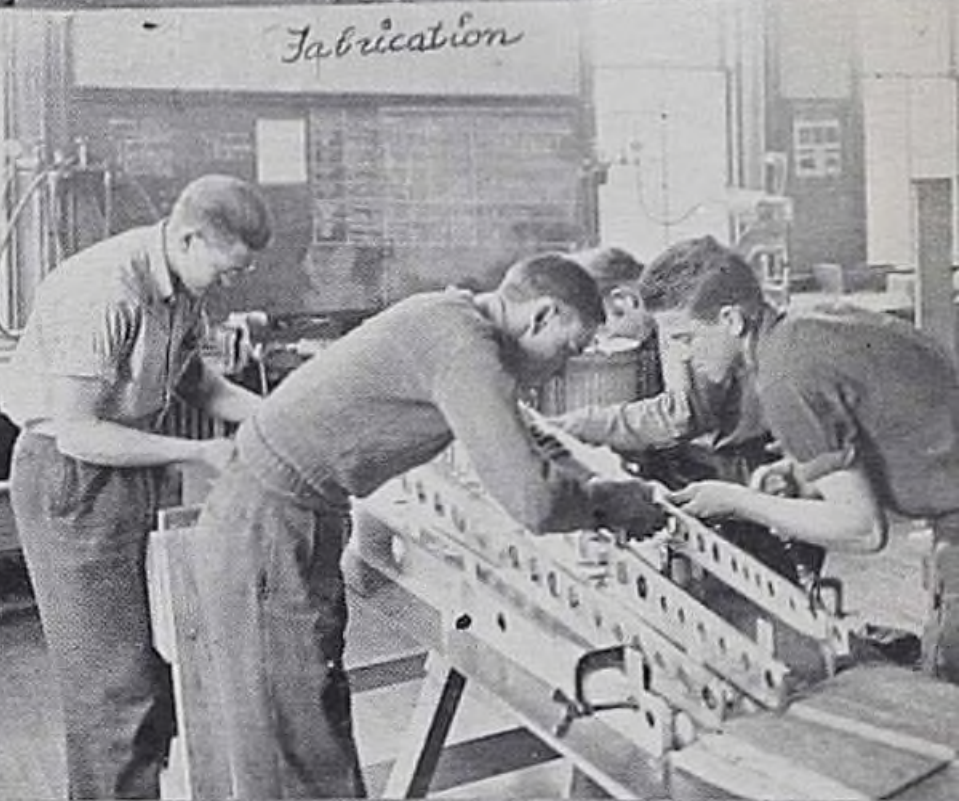

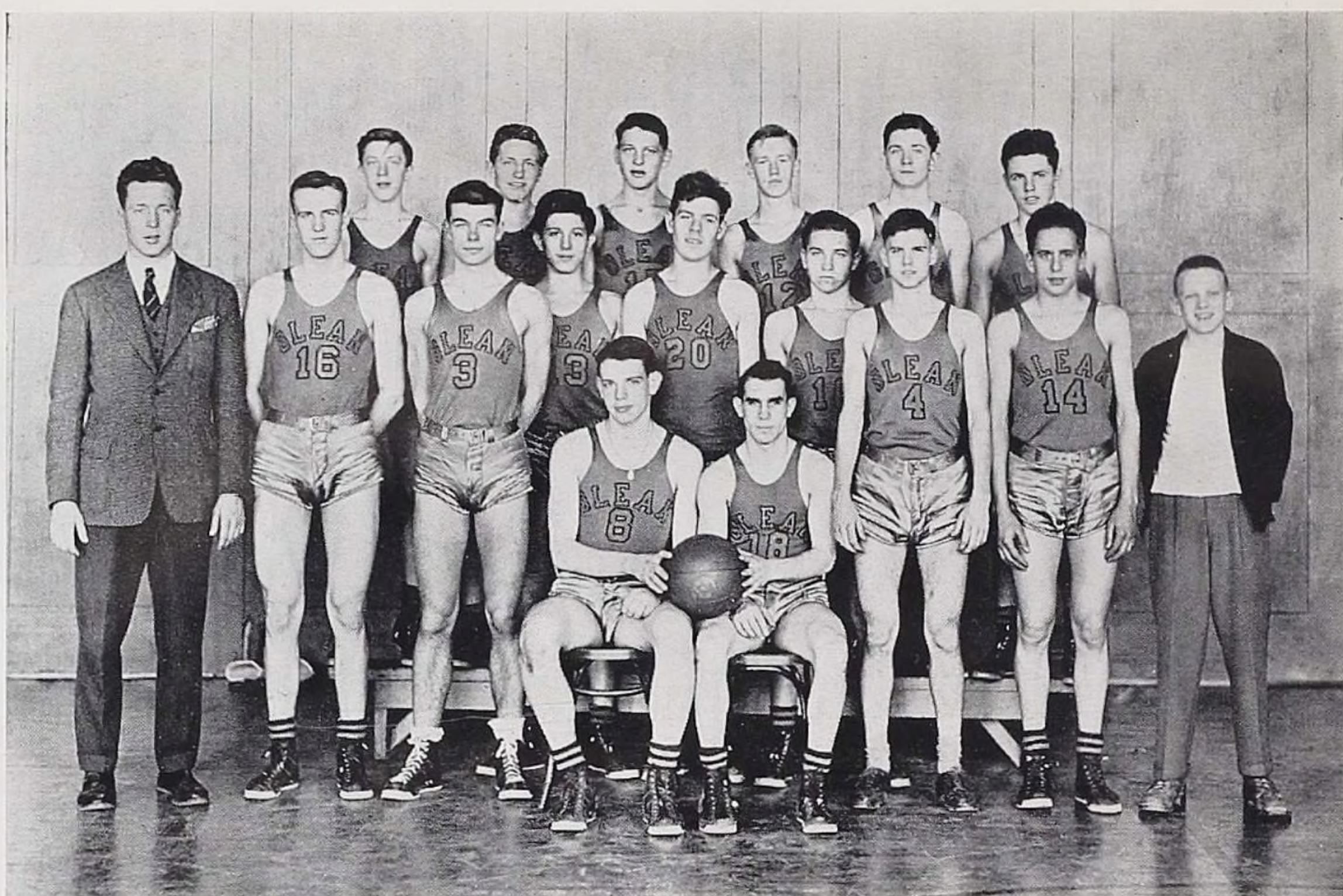


Junior Varsity

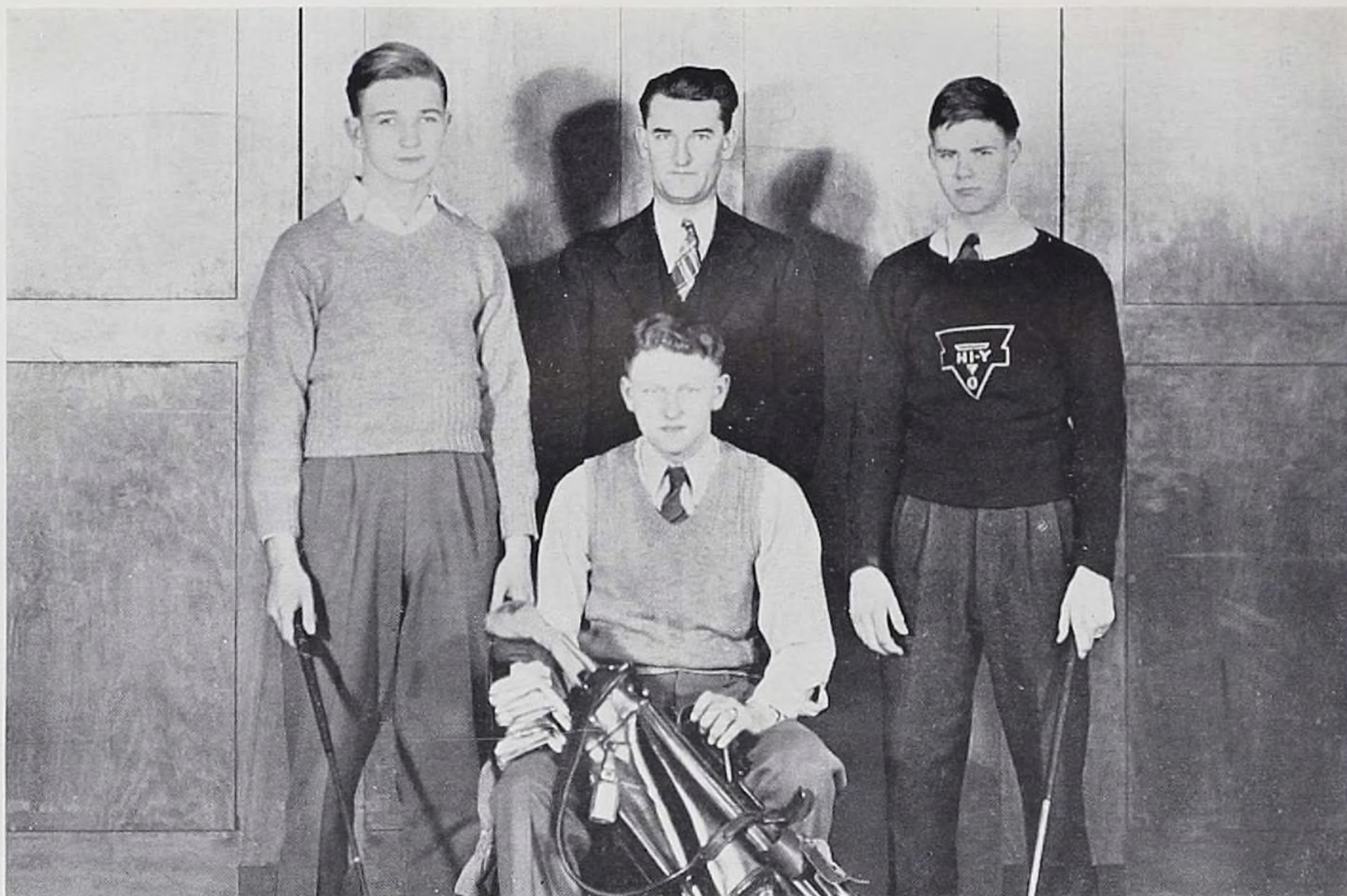
GOWANDA 25—OLEAN 27

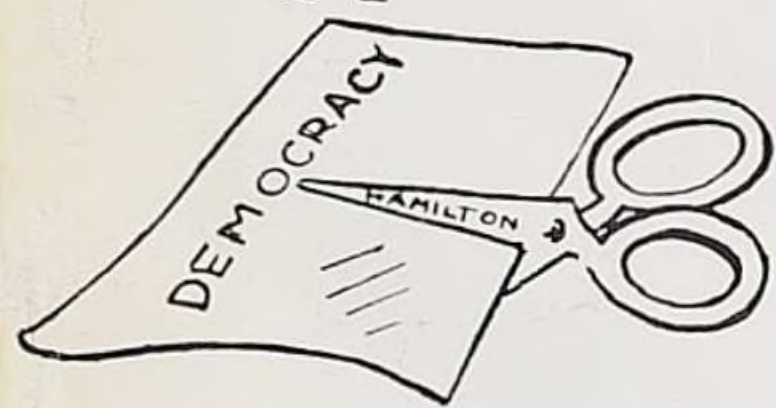
