D^{URING} the past year, a striking phrase has come into our American speech—"The Four Freedoms,"—"freedom of speech and expression," "freedom of every person to worship God in his own way . . . ," "freedom from want," and "freedom from fear." Our generation of young people must strive for the personally enriched life-experiences that alone can give vitality to a widened sense of world citizenship. These enriched experiences can come only from diversified interests and activities, wider acquaintanceship, enlarged fields for self-expression which characterize the newer courses and the extra-curricular activities of the socialized and humanized school program.

This year the club is hoping to send a representative to the Home Economics Convention in New York City. The Olean High School Club is a member of both the State and National Home Economics Clubs.












Both these librarians and Miss Hazel Collins of the O. P. L. attended the State Library Convention at Lake Mohonk in the fall. In January Miss Schleich gave an informal talk on current New York plays to the High School Dramatic Club.

On the home front, as the book week gift of the librarian, eight banners of Democracy and Denfense were raised in the colorful and timely posters of the N. Y. S. W. P. A. Art Project, some slogans of which have been used in the make-up of this 1942 Yearbook. Even more prophetic were they than the play. On November 8, 1941, these posters of Democracy and Defense were mere decorative reminders of a book week in a country yet at peace. In one month on December 8, 1941, they became the symbols of a war cry of another Battle Hymn of our Republic.
