





## MR. HERBERT L. SACKETT

PRINCIPAL OLEAN HIGH SCHOOL 1916-1943

RADUATING from Forestville High School, Mr. Sackett completed his teacher training course at Fredonia Normal School, Fredonia, New York. Following this preliminary training, he took his Bachelor of Philosophy and Master of Arts degrees at Brown University. Further graduate work was completed at Harvard University, University of Chicago, and Columbia University.

While in college he was actively engaged in the Glee Club, in the Debating Team, as Managing Editor of his College Yearbook, as Class Historian, and as President of combined Musical Clubs. He was a member of Kappa Sigma Fraternity and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa Society.

Following his graduation from Brown he instructed in philosophy for one year at Brown University, two years as Master of Science at Pingry Preparatory School, Elizabeth, New Jersey; two years as principal of the high school at Dunkirk, New York; seven years as principal of the County High School at Lewistown, Montana; and twenty-six years as principal of the High School at Olean, New York.

Actively engaged in projects contributing to educational advancement, he has been a member of the Central Athletic Committee since 1929, Chairman of the State Central Committee 1931, 1932, President of the State Association of Secondary School Principals 1924, wrote and directed the Pageant commemorating the 50th anniversary of the State Association of Secondary School Principals, and completed and published the Fifty Year History of the Associated Academic Principals' Association begun by the late Avery W. Skinner and left unfinished at his death.

Since assuming the principalship of the Olean High School he has been actively engaged in many civic and community affairs. As President of the Little Theatre Guild for several years, President of Kiwanis Club, President of Torch Club, President of Olean Men's Club and member of the Session of the Presbyterian Church, he has contributed generously of his time and energy that others might benefit.

A sound philosopher, an educational leader, a cooperative worker, a generous contributor to projects for civic betterment, Mr. Sackett retires with the good wishes of the community that he and Mrs. Sackett may enjoy many years of a well earned, profitable, retirement.

# OUR SCHOOL AT WAR

THE year of 1943. The Nation at War. We think of "War" as a series of dramatic actions, a medley of screeching shells, the 400-mile-an-hour swoop of the dive bomber, the roaring advance of tanks, the dash of the destroyer, the thundering broadside of the battleship—and great shells striking their target, twenty miles away.

But back of all this, stretches a supply line of workers and materials—men and women in factories, blood donors, Red Cross workers, airplane spotters, war bond sellers, patient sitters at communication centers, and tenders of victory gardens. The machine gun, the riveting gun, and the spray gun are all working at the same job.

In America's "all out" war, O. H. S. is playing its loyal part. Eight of our teachers are in service. Some 1500 of our boys are wearing the uniforms of the various armed forces, and are fighting on every front. The pupils of our undergraduate group are vying with each other in civilian service—in making possible the maintenance of a ten-million army in the battle fronts of the world. Besides their effort to attain physical fitness and mechanical proficiency for possible war activity, they are buying War Stamps and Bonds, manning observation posts, acting as air wardens, building model-airplanes for identification purposes at aviation schools, rolling bandages, collecting scrap and tending "Victory Gardens".

In our zeal for the "war effort", however, we are not forgetting the needs of the post war period and the return of peace. Our English and our social science classes, our student organizations, such as "We, The Students", are striving to instill a world consciousness and a world mindedness into the minds of our youth, as a necessary prerequisite to this new era. We must sense the need of greater unity, within our nation; we must continue with unity among the United Nations; we must look forward to unity among all the peoples of the world. The O. H. From another of these "old boys" Joseph Gasdick, a former member of the ground crew of the Flying Tigers, the library received Exhibit A, a two yuan Chinese shin-plaster bearing a picture of the Generalissimo and worth currently fifty-nine cents.

On November 13th and April 2nd, the librarian conducted Army and Navy examination and aptitude tests. She also presented the faculty of the English, Commercial and Social Studies Departments with a six page annotated bibliography on our twelve groups of reference books.

Our library has taken advantage of its priority on book lacquer for our new books. These include personal narratives like "They Were Expendable", plays like "This is War", fiction like "The Seventh Cross", refreshers in Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics, Nutrition, Aviation and War Terms for Commercial Classes and Social Studies on our relations with other countries and planning for a just and lasting peace. Of these, 24 titles are on shop subjects of practical help in the war effort.






THE HOME ECONOMICS CLUB is an important, helpful activity of Olean High School. For three years it has sponsored the Red Cross which has promoted many useful projects.




