






FOREWORD

OLEAN HIGH SCHOOL is more than bricks and mortar. It is people; it is action; it is an ideal; it is a conviction.



A Message to the Class of 1945

A MERICA has been defined as "the place, where anything can happen,"—and I add,—"and does." So it has come about that a country, that is founded on the principles of peace, equal rights, and the "brotherhood of man," is perhaps the leading allied participant in the deadliest war of all history.

America is not a warring nation. Except for marching-drill in gymnasium, no subject, even savoring of military science, enters into the curricula of our schools. Yet the boys from our high schools, who, only a year or two ago, were in English or geometry classes, attending Junior proms, and playing basketball, are battling to a standstill the panzer divisions of a nation, where militarism has been an art, for generations, and whose entire and intensive school training has been a professional training for war.

Perhaps at no time since its founding, has our public school system proven itself more worthy of acclaim,—than in the way in which our boys have met the challenge of the unexpected, the terrifying, the soul-shattering. American opportunism is winning against preparedness; resourcefulness against training; native courage and conviction of purpose against fanaticism and arrogance. Originality and quick-thinking are winning against routined training and regimented thought. Our boys have developed, in their schooling, the greatest quality of mind for war or for peace,—the ability to

change the aim, as the target moves.

The Class of 1945 is leaving its Alma Mater in, undoubtedly, the final year of the war. Its members will find their places and their work in the brave new world that is to be. Our more than two thousand one-time members of this school, who have kept the "American Way of Life" still open for you, are passing on to you the greater responsibility of **preserving** that "way of life." The fifty-five members, to whom this book is dedicated, have re-consecrated to you, as a priceless heritage, the safe-guarding and maintaining of that way of life,—a still "unfinished work."

Once more, "it is for us, the living," to take from the sacrifice of American heroes, a renewed devotion to that cause, for which men still give the last full measure of devotion.

And thus again should we, from **our** "honored dead", highly resolve that "these dead shall not have died in vain,"—but that, through our own fostering interest and care, **any** "government of the people, by the people, and for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

Through monthly council meetings, with senior Red Cross members, the officers learned where the junior members could help. The council and officers of the various classes sponsored a dime dance, a skating party to raise funds to give to the War Fund drive of Red Cross. About fifty boys conducted a tin can scrap drive, and turned the money obtained from this sale of scrap to the Junior Red Cross.

All these activities, together with the help of the grades in collecting waste paper and fats, earned them a sum of over two hundred and fifty dollars to give to the War Fund. In addition, the Junior Red Cross will be able to give at least two hundred dollars to the children of lands, devastated by war, to buy necessary clothing and supplies for them. This money is supplied from the funds received from the membership drive in the fall.

Olean High School can be proud of the work that its Junior Red Cross has done.




ASSEMBLIES

OLEAN HEALTH PROTECTION

EVERY year all pupils in the Olean Schools have a careful test of their sight and hearing, and a thorough examination of the heart. In addition to this routine program, special clinical examinations are made.

Over ninety per cent of all pupils in Olean are now protected against Diphtheria. That is the reason why there have been no cases of this dread disease in Olean in years amongst the students who have been protected. The five cases occuring this year had never been protected, one baby died and one school pupil developed a serious heart condition.

Since about eighty per cent have been vaccinated against Small Pox, there has been no case of Small Pox in Olean since 1929.

This year the importance of Tuberculosis control was emphasized. The Patch Test was used to indicate the presence or absence of tubercular germs in the body. Thirteen hundred and fifty-one pupils, all over thirteen years of age received this test. Three hundred pupils showed positive reactions, and were X-rayed to inform the doctors as to possible existence of the beginning of Tuberculosis in the lungs.

A few cases of slight tubercular infection were found. These cases will be X-rayed at intervals, active development will be guarded against; and the student-body will be thus protected against Tuberculosis.

The accompanying picture shows the routine employed in the X-ray examination.

Post-war Plans have been the pivot of this year's library service. Beginning at the fall Cattaraugus County Teachers' Convention an exhibit was set up on eight tables, of books, pamphlets and pictures covering the following subjects: World War, 1939—; Citizenship, United States and World; Our Neighbors; Our Allies; Our Enemies; "The Last Time I Saw Paris"; The Eternal City; Vital Needs. Visiting librarians and teachers paid most attention to the brightly colored Picture Sets with Texts, Vocational Guidance Monographs, checked Indexes and Bibliographies both printed and locally compiled, and the prize Care of Books poster.

Material in books, magazines, and pamphlets together with bibliographies have been in constant use by pupils preparing for the annual speaking Contest on the Constitution, and the Scholarship Examination sponsored by the Organization of Peace Commission.

All this ephemeral material will be added to the Verticle File for future use under Reconstruction, World War, 1939— with cross references from Bretton Woods, Teheran, Dumbarton Oaks, Yalta, Chapultepec and the San Francisco Conferences.

MUSIC FESTIVAL OLEAN HIGH SCHOOL, NOVEMBER 17, 1944

THE NEW YORK STATE MUSIC ASSOCIATION and the Olean High School Music Department sponsored a Music Festival for Southwestern New York on November 17 and 18, 1944. This was one of ten festivals conducted in New York State.

Nearly three hundred students participated in the Band, Orchestra, and Chorus. Rehearsals of the Festival groups were held Friday night and on Saturday with a concluding concert in the High School Auditorium on Saturday evening. Twenty-seven communities were represented. The crowded auditorium indicated the interest of Olean and the surrounding towns in the festival.

Guest directors of the groups were: Mr. Wallace Doubleday, Lockport, Orchestra; Mr. Paul Zellar, East Aurora, Choir; and Mr. Robert Grant, East Aurora, Band.

ACTIVITIES OF MUSICAL ORGANIZATIONS

The Choir sang at the Cattaraugus Teachers' Association, at a special assembly and at the Christmas Concert.

The Glee Club sang at the Christmas Concert and gave a Christmas Program at the Clark Brothers' Company Plant. They also took part in the Spring Concert.

The Band presented an assembly program, played at the Spring Concert, on Memorial Day, and at Commencement.

The Orchestra played at the Cattaraugus County Teachers' Association, at the Christmas Concert, at the Junior Play, the Senior Play, and the Spring Concert.

ACTIVITIES OF SPECIAL MUSIC GROUPS

Several groups of the various organizations have appeared on special occasions during the year. Five members of the Choir, nine of the Band, and thirty-one members of the Orchestra participated in the Festival Concert in November.

A small band has played at each assembly.

The lowing participated: Lois Easley, Choir; Seth Bell, Band; Doreen Davis, accompanist of the Choir and Orchestra; and William Storner, Band.

THE FIGHTING LITTLES


"THE FIGHTING LITTLES" is a comedy in three acts, adapted by Caroline Franke from the novel of the same name by Booth Tarkington.

A sprightly and self-sufficient girl, Goody prefers the casual, amiable Ham Ellers. Mrs. Little does her best to keep things peaceful, but humorously fails. Business-like Norman Peel, when he learns that Mr. Little likes him, even goes so far as to suggest not only that Mr. Little doesn't run his business properly but that he, Norman, could improve it considerably. When he tries to buy his way into the business through his snobbish aunt, it is too much for Mr. Little who is forced to admit that he was wrong. Ham Ellers, on the other hand, turns out to be a thoroughly likeable fellow. As to son Filmer—he finds himself in love with the girl next door, takes a dare and wrecks the family car just outside the windows. Mr. Little is forced to reconsider his preconceptions of worth in his children and their friends; this is a difficult thing for a man like Mr. Little to do.







OLEAN 38-GOWANDA 37


Gowanda was defeated here in a post season game for the Double A. A. Championship.


