Two string ensembles and several soloists participated in the competition festivals at Hornell, receiving high ratings.


String ensembles have rendered many civic services playing for church, P.T.A. programs, broadcasts over W.H.D.L., and have afforded tea and dinner music on many occasions.


THE GLEE CLUB AND CHOIR




ASSEMBLIES

The Huskies showed some of their 'never say die' spirit, as they came back from the Jamestown loss, and upset the highly favored Dunkirk eleven 13-12.


OLEAN 0 - BRADFORD 38







OLEAN 51 - ALFRED-ALMOND 59




OLEAN 40 - GOWANDA 43
