We shelf books, check magazines, make book lists, and check overdue books. Some of us are helping to revise the pamphlet file.



VARSITY BASKETBALL

THE SEASON of 1947-48 was perhaps one of the most successful in recent years for the Olean High School Basketball team. The starting five, composed of Larry Carnicelli, with an average of 13 points a game, Joe Kelly, Lee Winters, Dewey Williams, and Pat McCabe, under the direction of Coach Kunkle, decisively defeated Salamanca to take the county championship, but were defeated by Jamestown in the Cattaraugus-Chautauqua County playoffs.


Working capably as reserves during the season were Max Keller, Dick Johnson, Gene Eyler, Joe DeRose, Johnny DeGolyer, Jerry Murphy, and Jim Garvey. Of the varsity squad members, Carnicelli, Winters, Kelly and Garvey are seniors and will be lost to the squad, unless they return to play under the new post-graduate ruling. The remainder of the squad are sophomores and juniors and will return for at least another season of play.



The Huskies lost their opening game to Falconer, 26-43, but bounced back to defeat a favored Jamestown quint, 41-38, on the Falcons' own court. Randolph Central School shaded Olean 35-33 in the Huskie first home game, but again the Hilltoppers came back to wallop Wellsville 52-40, Allegany 44-29, Salamanca 39-27 and to stage an upset victory over Bradford, 44-34. But their winning streak was snapped at four games by Gowanda who defeated Olean, 24-45. A strong Erie Tech five went down before the Huskies 44-43, and it appeared as though Olean was off on another series of victories. But Salamanca, previously defeated by Olean, took advantage of playing on their own floor and defeated the Red and Gold 23-29. Next Hornell defeated the Huskies, 30-51, and then Erie Academy, 44-45, before Olean staged a comeback. The Huskies evened the score with Randolph, defeating the Central School five, 40-29, and went on to defeat Allegany the second time, 33-16, but were stopped by Bradford, who came to Olean to hand the Hilltoppers a 37-43 defeat.

The Red and Gold then journeyed to Corning only to be edged by the Free Academy, 47-48. Having split a two-game series with Salamanca, Olean again met the Warriors on the Randolph court, winning 53-49, to become county champions. In their final game of the season, Olean defeated a favored Gowanda team 58-36. In the post-season game with Jamestown to decide the championship of Cattaraugus-Chautauqua Counties, the Huskies received a 49-34 setback.







The girls make up most of their own stunts, and have fun practicing them.





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
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
