THE Junior Business Club was organized by members of the Business Department at the beginning of the second semester under the sponsorship of Mr. Thomas.





THE Driver Training Class for the second semester in the school year of 1948-49 includes 45 members. Three students and the instructor go out driving each driving period for behind-the-wheel instruction. Every student should have at least eight hours of driving plus 32 hours of observation. Each takes a road test for a New York State Automobile Operator's License with the driver training car. In addition to the behind-the-wheel training, classroom work and textbook study is required. Some of the students enrolled have an opportunity to practice their behind-the-wheel lessons by driving their parents' car after school hours as additional homework.

The greatest number of accidents in our country are caused by the 16 to 19 year old boy and girl. It is the aim of the driver training course in the public schools of the United States to lower this high accident rate.



# MICE AND MEN



THIS term an interesting experiment, directed by Mr. Paul Whitehill, was conducted by the students of the Olean High School chapter of the Junior Red Cross.

Four albino rats were used: two males and two females. One rat was given a wholesome mild diet; another was given milkless diet. One rat was fed a "balanced school lunch" and his cousin subsisted on a "hamburger-cola" lunch. These diets were maintained for about four weeks. Weighings and observations were made twice a week.
