Tell-O-Scope, the official Olean High School newspaper is published weekly as often as possible by a group of students under the jurisdiction of Mr. Richard McLaughlin, O.H.S. English and Journalism teacher.

The usually two-page five-cent issue, the only paper of its kind in New York State, is put out in offset form; that is, the back page is printed; the front page mimeographed. This makes possible the occasional printing of pictures on the back page.

Marie Cucchiaro, our varitypist, is employed to type the stencil for the mimeograph and also to type the copy for the back page which must be pasted up on a dummy before being sent in to the printer.

Every Thursday, a staff meeting is held after school in Room 109 at which the reporters are given their assignments. Later in the afternoon both senior staff and reporters meet in the outer office where the sheets are mimeographed, counted out, and assigned to homerooms.

Recently, a ten-cent four-page issue has been put out bi-weekly. This is being planned as a regular activity and may develop into a weekly edition.

Since most of the senior staff are seniors, next year's Tell-O-Scope will be run by a new staff picked from this year's reporters.

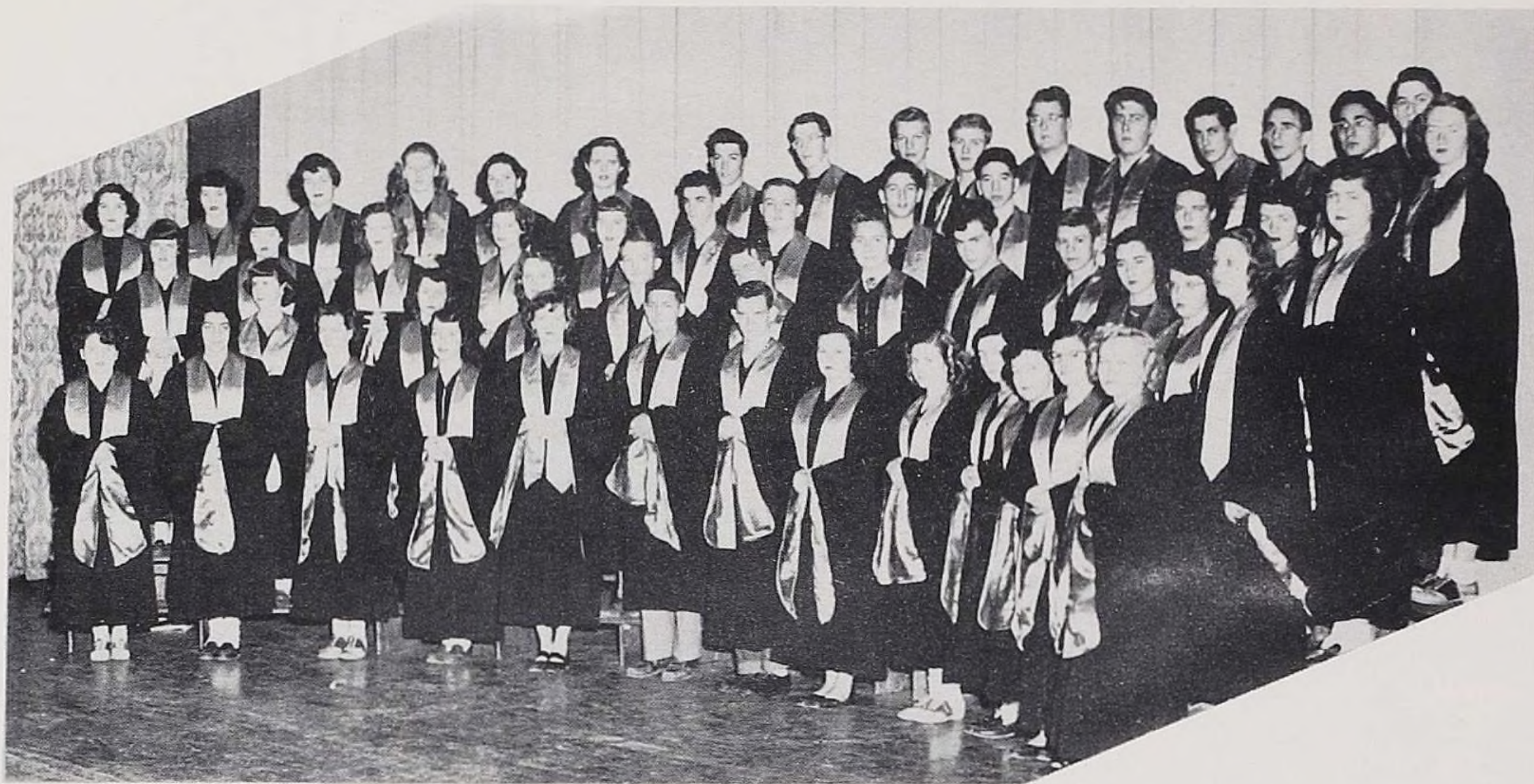

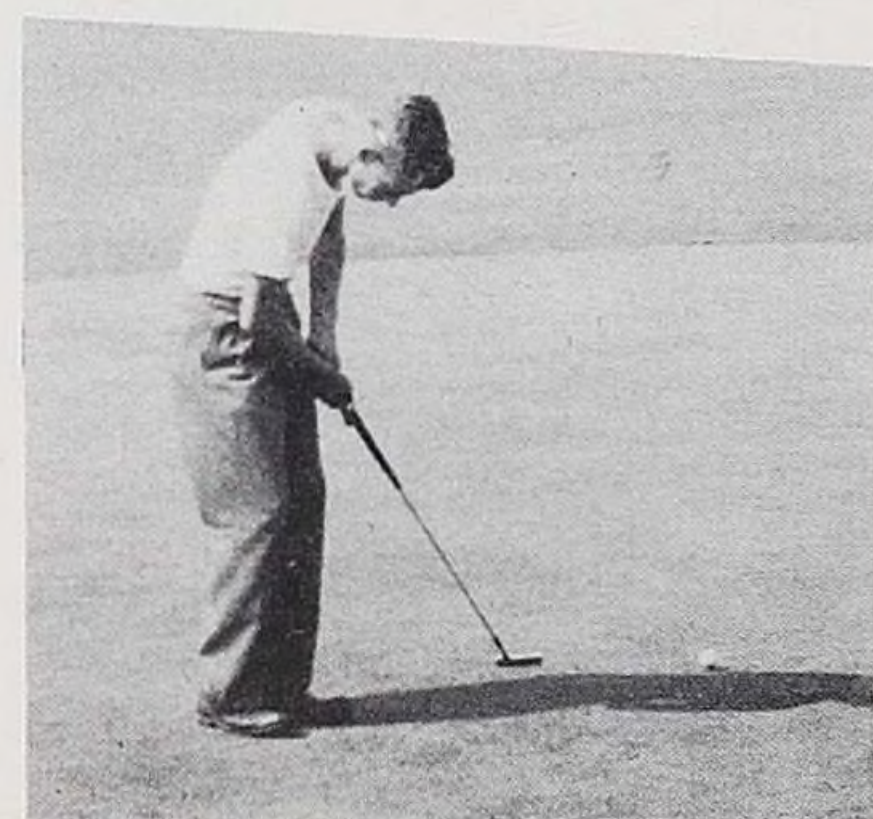
Golf

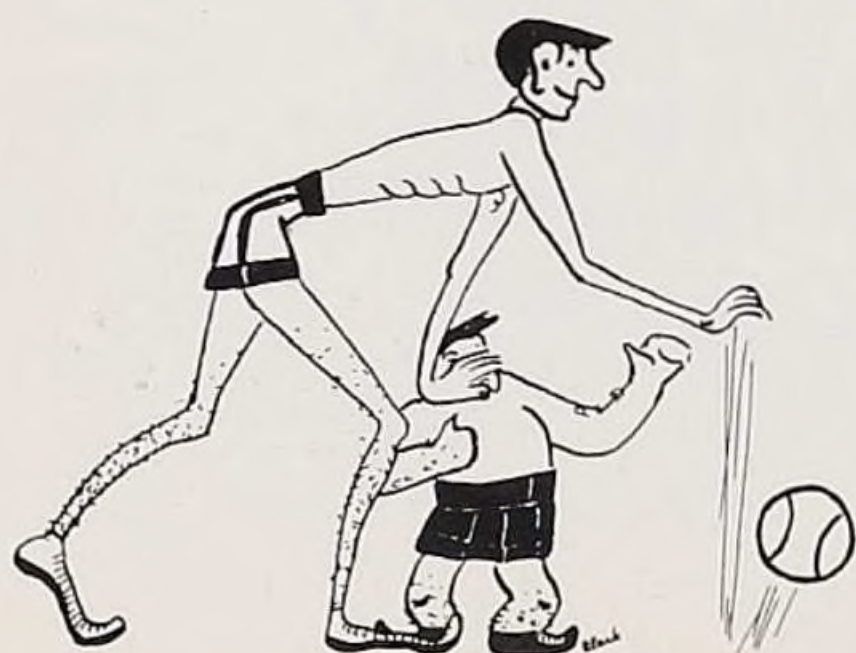
- 1 The Huskies toppled the Salamanca Warriors at Salamanca.
