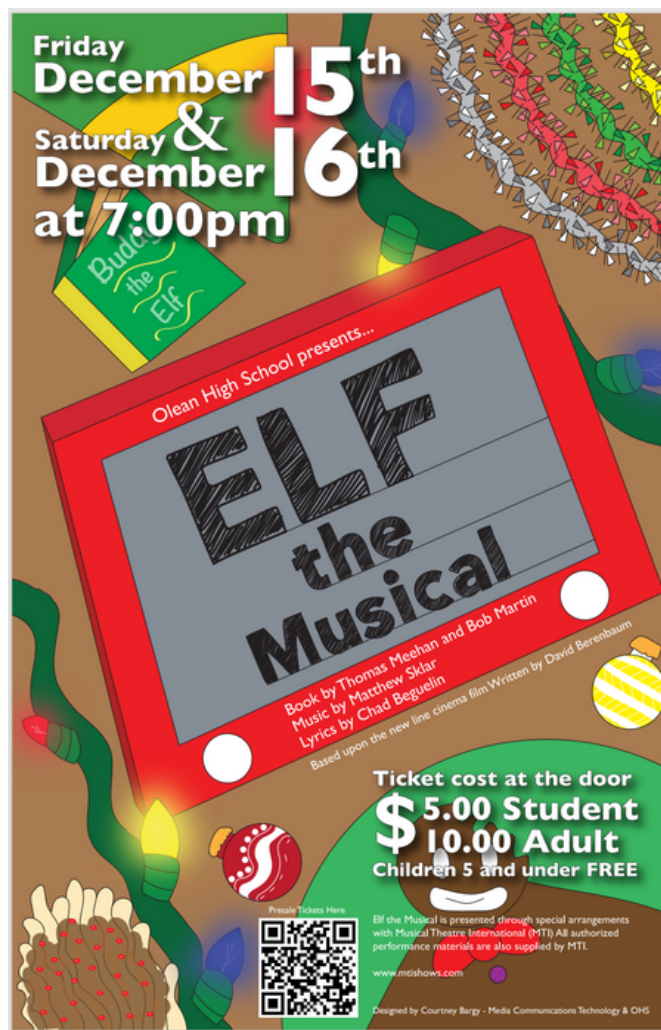
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Save the Date for the Upcoming Musical Performance:

Welcome New School Board Members:

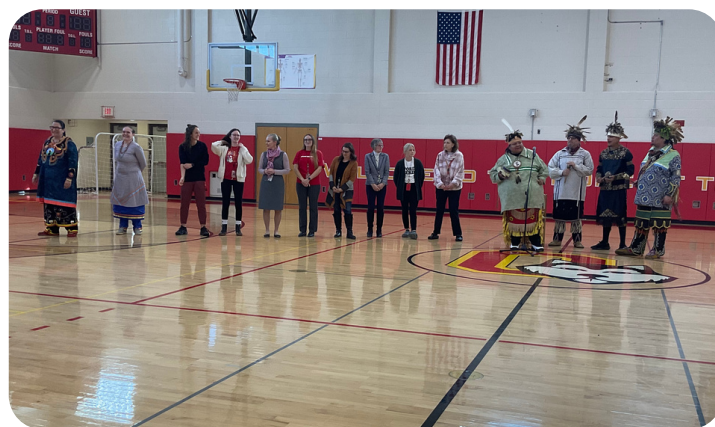

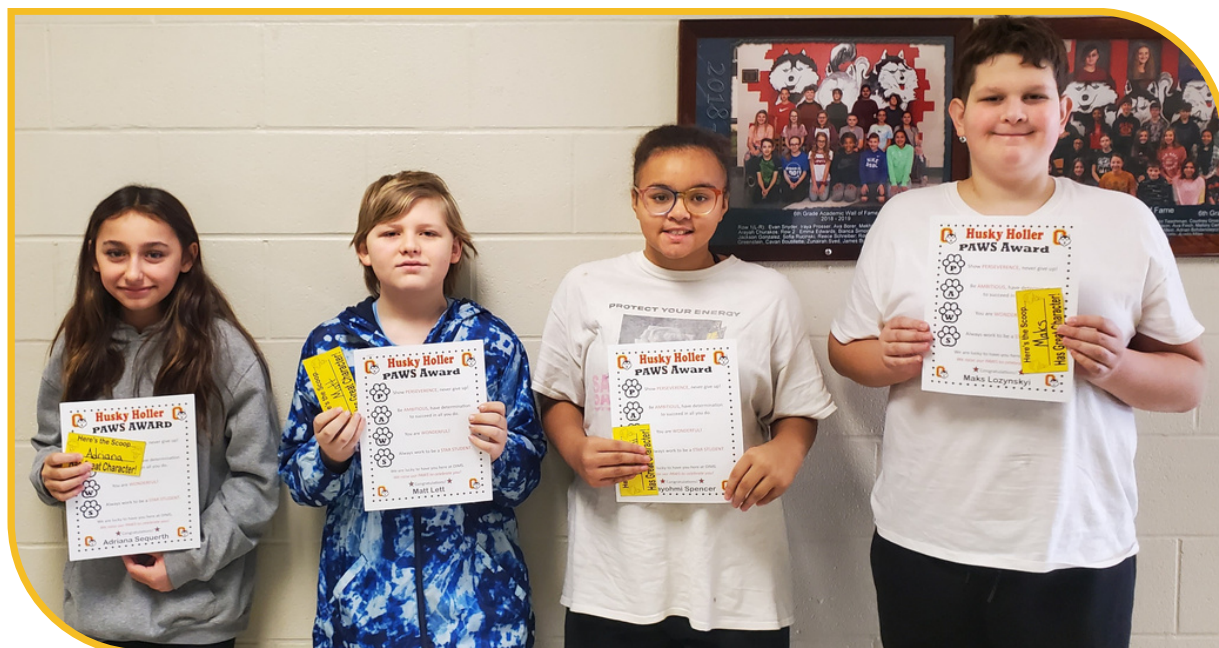
