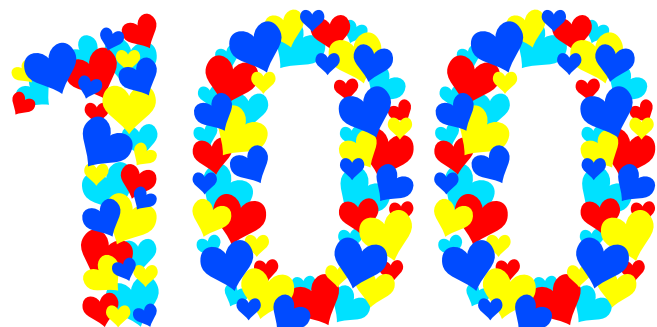
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100 Days At School:

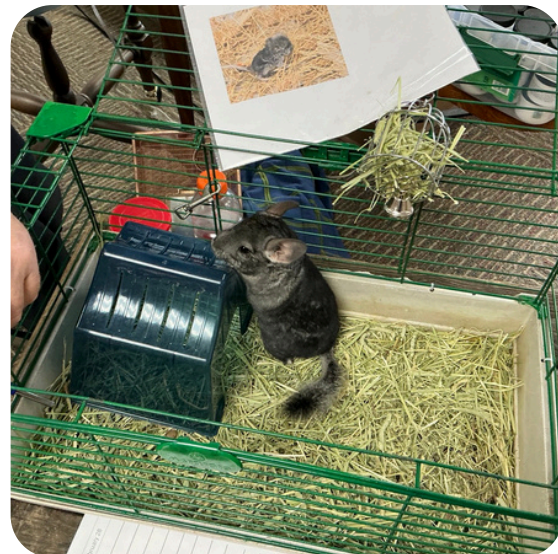
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Meet Raisin:
